The laptops are for In-House use only and are not available for circulation outside the library.

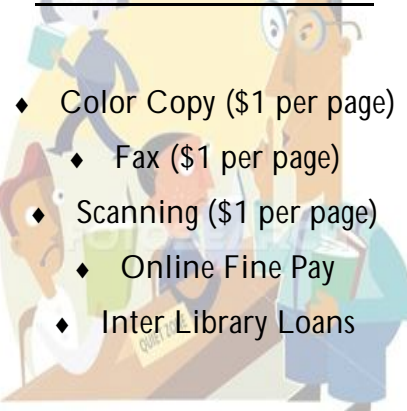

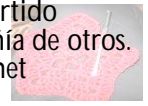
